Bird Builds a Nest by Martin Jenkins

Budding scientists will enjoy this trio of sweet books in the *A First Science*Storybook series. Simple concepts include: pushing and pulling, the four seasons (*The Squirrels' Busy Year*), and the concept of light and dark (*Fox at Night*).



A Beetle Is Shy by Dianna Hutts Aston



Prickly Hedgehogs! by Jane McGuinness



The Truth About Hippos by Maxwell Eaton III



Series includes: slug, spider, toad, rat, fly, and head lice.



Woodpecker Wham! by April Pulley Sayre

The Blue Whale by Jenni Desmond
